5. Treasurer's Report

Accounts 2023/24 - See Appendix A. Printed copies were distributed.

Pam Fitzpatrick introduced herself to any new members and explained that her resignation had been accepted by the committee. This was therefore her 8th and last AGM as Treasurer for IAA.

IAA had made a profit on both exhibitions again this year, doing well as always with Ann Woodcock leading the Catering team, and Marj Jones with the Raffle Prizes.

Our new auditor, in February, praised the introduction of the card reader, which has enabled potential buyers to purchase on the spot without having to go up the road to a cash machine, which had in the past lost us the sale!

Last year 2022/23 our Charity donation was £150 to the Blood Bikes, Wirral, Merseyside, Chester.

Sadly last year, long standing member, Graham Kay, passed away. His daughter donated art materials and books to IAA to sell at the Monday Afternoon group. The committee agreed that £100 of the proceeds would be donated to the Pulmonary Fibrosis Trust.

In yearend accounts 23/24 the November Exhibition gave us £200 profit for charity.

It was agreed by the committee to combine it with the art material sale giving a total of £300 gifted in memory of Graham Kay, IAA.

Pam stressed that although she will no longer be the treasurer, she will still be around as a member of IAA and a helper if or when required.

Pam then thanked the members, committee and any others she'd met along the way over the last 8 years, saying she'd met some special people and made lovely friends that she hoped to keep in touch with.

Marj summarised as follows, explaining what good value the Monday Afternoon Group is: -

- Rent for 15 weeks is £630
- The price can be kept down due to the numbers attending
- The cost to members is £15 for 15 weeks i.e. £1 per week
- 54 members on the books for period Jan April 2024
- The numbers are different each term
- Not all come every week
- · Refreshments are free i.e. come out of the fees
- Donations from any art material sales goes into the bank
- Cash is requested for subs as the subs are paid into the bank via the Post Office who don't accept cheques
